7. INDIAN ASSOCIATION OF SURGICAL GASTROENTEROLOGY (IASG):

For the first time, IASG initiated a special program on GI Clinics for trainees (MCh / DNB) students which included case discussions, interactions with senior faculty at training centres and sessions aimed at discussing the various elements at an end of training qualification examination. This was held on 26th - 27th February 2011 at the Asian Institute of Gastroenterology, Hyderabad and was organized by Dr GV Rao and Dr. R. Pradeep. The program was attended by about 50 trainees.
